CALL TO ORDER:

Member Kissinger moved for the approval of the May 21, 2024 Meeting Minutes. Seconded by Member Cohen.

On roll call, all voted yes, and Chairman Scott declared this set of Minutes adopted.

APPLICATIONS:

1. Approval of Temporary to Final Sign Permit Application Re: Chrome Salon: 42 No. Main St.

Harold Knebel was present on behalf of 42 No. Main.

Discussion of the procedure to ensure compliance with requirements of the zoning code. The Planning Board required the Code Enforcement Officer to issue a building permit.

Ms. Schlagel stated that Mr. Pawliczek has already recused himself from this application and Mayor Harter has signed off the Temporary Permit.

Attorney Cassidy stated that she would coordinate with the Mayor to see whether he would like her to review the application to confirm compliance.

Member Cohen moved a resolution to approve ARB approval for the Chrome Salon at 42 No. Main St. and to move the permit from temporary to final. Seconded by Member Kissinger.

On roll call, all voted yes and Chairman Scott declared this resolution adopted.

2. Lempka (Self Storage)

Attorney Cassidy stated that the Secretary Schlagel has recirculated the SEQRA Notice of Intent to be Lead Agency and the board will be able to assume Lead Agency at our next meeting.

Engineer D'Andrea then advised the board of the initial finds of the Traffic Impact Study and indicated that additional work will need to be done so that the applicant can come up with a solution for managing the traffic from all buildings on the site.

Al Muhlrad advised the board that he does not ever remember there being an accident, and if there was it was not his fault.

Engineer D'Andrea stated that he could not provide Mr. Muhlrad or anyone with the accident data from NYSDOT, due to personal information provided in the data and NYSDOT prohibits its dissemination to the public.

The board then further discussed impacts from NS's proposed NYS Rte. 94 upgrade project and the additional traffic on Meadow Ave exiting and entering.
